

26 graduates have been added to the ABIDE Alumni Association...

This has been a busy season for ABIDE as we ran girls and boys programs at the same time. We had a full house of boys in Kabale, while the girls were in Mbarara (about 2 1/2 hours apart). I was among some of the few staff members that occasionally traveled between the houses, so I was able to stay connected with the boys, even though my main focus was the girls.

At the beginning of the six months, I was taking on the title of Acting Mbarara House Administrator, as Joseline, the Administrator, was on maternity leave. My responsibilities increased significantly for those weeks. When Joseline returned she took back some of her responsbilities (thankfully the ones I did not like too much, or am not so good at), but left me with many others for the remaining months!

I continued to teach Veritas, the curriculum we use for Bible interpretation. I really enjoyed seeing the students grasp how to read Scripture with the intent of understanding what the message was to the original audience, and how that impacts our application of it today. It is so easy to misunderstand the actual message of a passage, and then teach it incorrectly. I've really come to love being a better student, and therefore teacher, of the Bible!

One of our foundational classes is on the Gospel of John. I had the privilege of teaching this class as well. In fact, these lectures are often what took me to the boys' house in Kabale. We focus most of our time on chapters 13-17: Jesus' last night with his disciples. A close look at these chapters and these intimate

moments Jesus had with those who he was discipling really shows that the focus is on relationships...Which is exactly what we try to model in ABIDE. In fact, we like to say that *real relationships ignite true transformation*.

Throughout ABIDE, it is our goal to see God use us as His tools to transform students in Christian faith, character, and leadership. By God's grace, we have seen it happen!

A couple of weeks before graduation, we had a mission team from Village Bible Church come to Uganda. During their first week in the country they spent a few days with the ABIDE girls, then went to Kabale and spent a few days with the ABIDE boys. We decided to focus on creating opportunities to do ministry together, so that the students and team members were building relationships while ministering to other people with the Gospel. I was encouraged to see the groups join together so quickly and easily. It was also brought smiles to the faces of us as staff when we heard the VBC team members speak highly of our students.

One simple testimony of transformation was clear to me on graduation day. The students were asked to select one person from each house to give a speech about the impact of ABIDE on behalf of all of them. The one who was chosen to speak in front of hundreds of people was the very girl who couldn't stand in front of a small group of people for more than a few seconds back in January. Most people present at the celebration wouldn't realize the significance of such a moment, but as staff members, we were beaming with pride all day as we looked at 26 changed lives in front of us.
