One person was blindfolded. The other remained on the line, giving verbal directions for the partner to navigate around various obstacles in order to find me in the midst of the items scattered around the grounds.

Imagine sixteen students shouting out directions across a field, all at once. Students are straining to listen to the correct voice, trusting their partner to guide them well to the end goal.

As a staff member, I always love watching the students struggle through the *obstacle course*. One reason I enjoy it is because it is quite entertaining to see the variety of emotions and responses to the task. This time, since I was the one students were trying to find, I had to

Recently we took a mission to his village with all the ABIDE students and staff. I have been to his village and met his family many times. But this time I had joy in seeing his natural gifting as a pastor. He was the student who was most involved in organizing the events of the ministry, and did very well. Yet, what I loved witnessing the most was walking through the village and seeing him stop and greet just about everyone we found along the way, inviting them to church, the film show, crusade, or whatever other activity was coming up. I was really

proud of Rauben, and happy to see how God is at work in his life.

Not only Rauben, but all of the students have been growing in their faith. They have all come to ABIDE from different perspectives and at different stages in their relationships with Christ, yet they are showing that the program is having a positive impact on their lives.

Currently, we are about to complete our mid-term break. For three weeks, students have gone back home, and are expected to be active in their homes and churches, practicing the various lessons and skills that they have been learning. For staff, our break is cut a little short as we come back together to have some meetings. As mentors, we desire to evaluate the program, discuss what progress we have seen with our students, how we can improve, what needs the students still have, etc. The intention is to refocus as a team so that we are most effectively in loving and training these young adults God has entrusted into our care. excited to see what God has in store for ABIDE in the next several weeks!
